Preparing the next generation of leaders, scholars, and decision-makers to thrive in a complex and rapidly changing world - where our national interests are intertwined with the global community - is one of the greatest challenges facing our country. It requires a renewed enthusiasm for global studies in our high schools. Too many American students today fall behind their counterparts from other countries in their knowledge and understanding of world history, geography, and current international events.

Developed by the World Affairs Councils of America as a flagship youth education program, Academic WorldQuest™ is a fun, friendly, and engaging team-based knowledge competition designed for high school students keen to learn more about current international politics, geography, global economics, history, and world cultures. WACA has expanded the program to some 50 Councils that host local AWQ competitions annually that engage nearly 5,000 high school students nationwide.

The Columbia World Affairs Council boasts over 20 years of participation in Academic WorldQuest and begins outreach to regional high schools in the fall of each year. Typically, teams will prepare in an after-school setting over the course of several months. In spring, teams throughout the region will first compete in our locally sponsored competition. We have hosted teams from AC Flora, Chapin, Dutch Fork, Lexington, and River Bluff High Schools, as well as the Gwinnett School of Mathematics, Science, and Technology from Lawrenceville, Georgia. In partnership with the University of South Carolina's Walker Institute of International Studies, the local competition is hosted on USC campus and also offers a first glimpse at the many opportunities to pursue international studies in higher education. Finally, the winning team is invited to the Carlos and Malú Alvarez Academic WorldQuest™ National Competition in Washington D.C. The national competition is attended by the nation's most promising high school students each year, along with their parents, teachers, and chaperones.



The National Academic WorldQuest Championship Weekend provides a unique opportunity for students to visit the nation's capital, perhaps for the first time, and includes the AWQ National Competition, unique programming planned to enhance the global education experience, and an opportunity to meet and engage with approximately 250 like-minded peers from around the United States.
